Prayer: Our Father

Starter: "Remember the icon": The task is to name a person or an object from of the icon of Nativity, which was discussed during the previous lesson. Leader needs a small light ball. He throws the ball first to someone in the group for them to answer. Then this student throws it to the another one. Every student has 5 second for answering.

Learning objectives:

- 1. To be familiar with some of the parables about the Kingdom of God.
- 2. To understand that Christ showed us the way to the Kingdom of God.
- 3. To realize that every day we pray for the Kingdom of God with the words of Lord's Prayer.

Core Activities and Learning

- 1. Discussion (introduction to the new lesson): Leader asks questions about the words of the Lord's prayer: "Thy Kingdom come. Thy will be done in earth, as it is in heaven." For what kind of kingdom do we pray in this prayer? Whose will is presented in this kingdom? What do we pray for with these words? Transition to the new lesson: The Kingdom of God exists since the beginning of the world. Residents of this Kingdom are the Angels and all people who have ever lived in the world. After the Second coming of Christ, all pious people will have place in The Kingdom of God. Our Lord Jesus Christ often used parables to teach us. He taught some parables about the Kingdom of God.
- 2. Leader reads Matthew 25:31-36 What does Christ says to us with this parable? What should we do to merit a place into the Kingdom of God? We should be merciful to Christ's smaller brothers –people who suffer; we should do deeds of love.
- 3. Activity 1: to memorize what we should do to take place in the Kingdom of God, students should connect the parts of verses from the previous reading (see the file activity 1).
- 4. Role reading of Matthew 13:24-30 one student is narrator, other two the master of the field and the servant. Then a discussion: who is the master of the field? Who is the enemy of the master? Who are the good and who are the bad seeds? How should we understand the word "harvest"?
- 5. Activity 2: scramble words on the basis of Luke 13:18-21 (see the file activity 2)
- 6. End piece: Keep silence for a minute.

Resources: New Testament + printed copies of the reading (in a large font).

Resource sheet for the Leader, Work sheet for the students

Review: Leader should remind to the students that we should accomplish deeds of love and service.

Follow up: Next week ask each student to recall one key thing that they have learned from the previous week
