Prayer: Trisagion Prayers

Starter: Ask the students to name any service books they already know and explain their purpose as far as they are able.

Learning objectives: To know some of the more regularly used service books and their contribution to the worship of the Church.

Core Activities and Learning

- 1. Explain the function of the service books of the Church. These are designed to cover both the whole year's celebrations, the ministries of the clergy and the lives of the saints for the emulation of holiness. They also contain the teaching of the Church and are rich in Scriptural and Patristic references. (Review summary below)
- 2. Distribute Resource Sheet 73 together with the crossword puzzle on Activity Sheet 73 Puzzle.
- 3. Deliver the puzzle solution to the students.
- 4. Bring in the library of the liturgical books held by the parish. Distribute 1 book to each student. Share the books if there are not enough.

TASK: On note paper (provided) prepare an encyclopaedia article describing the book allocated, its contents and use in the Orthodox Church. If laptops are available, the task can be completed electronically.

Resources: Resource Sheet 73, Activity Sheet 73 (Puzzle and Solution sheets), Note paper, pens, (laptops if available)

Follow Up: For next week research why the word "Eucharist" is often used for the Divine Liturgy.
