**Starter:** Name a person you love. Do you think you could give your life for that person? Christ gave His life for all of us. That's how much He loves us.

**Learning objectives:** To understand the meaning of the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ as the saving love of the Triune God and the importance of our response in thanksgiving to that with our lives.

## **Core Activities and Learning**

Refer to the meaning of the Crucifixion for humanity by emphasising the following points:

- God's glory is being shown in Christ's death and resurrection.
- Father, Son and Holy Spirit all act as one God in this saving event.
- God offers Forgiveness Luke 23:34 'Then Jesus said, "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing."- through the voluntary death of Christ, and opens the Gate of Paradise for us. (Review the other words Jesus said on the cross and their meanings).
- We are reconciled to God, as we had turned our back to Him in our sins.
- Jesus set an example of victorious sacrificial love for us. He loves us and gave His life for our salvation.
- In the same way we are called to take up our cross and follow His example of love and sacrifice.
- With His Crucifixion, Jesus completed His mission and purpose as a human being on earth.
- Jesus' Crucifixion needs to be connected with His Glorious Resurrection, the victory over death and sin. Describe this to children as a play that has different scenes, but these all need to be connected to each other, otherwise no one would understand the plot.
