Starter: Ask the children to describe a trip they may have made to a very holy place.

Learning objectives: To explore pilgrimages in the Orthodox Church, their meaning and purpose.

Core Activities and Learning

Explain what a pilgrimage is and why Christians perform them.

Refer to some important pilgrimages in the Orthodox Church.

- Jerusalem. The site of the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus.
- Bethlehem in Palestine. The birthplace of Jesus and King David.
- **Mount Athos**, Greece. A monastic republic. Only men are allowed to enter as the place according to the Orthodox Tradition is been devoted to only one woman, the Mother of God, Theotokos.
- **Mount Sinai** where Moses received the Ten Commandments from God (including at this site the Monastery of St Catherine).
- Parish Saints places, eg. Lindisfarne, Iona.
- Local National Saints, eg. St David's (Wales) and Local Regional Saints (Holywell, Wales): St Winefride.

(You can add to the list Pilgrimages that are significant in your country. The last two are two significant ones of the Orthodox Faith in the British Isles and Ireland.)

Complete the matching tasks with the names of the connected saints. (The correct answer for Bethlehem does NOT of course include Christ because this is not a saint's shrine. The Mother of God, Joseph etc would be acceptable answers – as also the Holy Sepulchre (St Joseph of Arimathea etc) since Christ is not a saint!)
