Learning objectives: - To understand the meaning and the importance of building an icon corner at home.

Core Activities and Learning

- Teachers are advised to spend about 10 minutes asking the students the following questions: what is an icon corner? Why it is important? Do you have one at home?
- Ask the students to name some of the icon corner's contents.
- Teacher then presents the PowerPoint slides with explanations.

ACTIVITY

Design an icon corner (on paper) – different from the one you may have at home.

A line drawing / plan is the important goal, labelled appropriately. It does not need to be coloured.

Resources: a laptop with and a projector to present the power point presentation.

Review: The icon corner is the family's place of worship which also called the home altar.

Follow Up: Say a prayer daily (before an icon if an icon corner is not available).
