Prayer: Trisagion Prayers

Starter: Game: What colour? Go through the major feasts of the Church and ask the students what colour(s) of flowers would be most appropriate for each.

Incense

- 1. Read from this web page:- http://www.greekboston.com/religion/incense/
- 2. In Revelation 5:8, 8:3-4, incense is associated with the prayer of the saints (in this context, the believers).
- 3. Read these texts to the students.
- 4. Place a hand censer with an icon, some flowers in a simple arrangement, a lamp, charcoal and incense grains on table in the middle of the room.
- 5. Distribute a piece of paper and a pen to each student. Ask each student to compose their own one sentence prayer. This is read out quietly in a time of shared prayer. Each time a prayer is offered, a single grain of incense is placed by the student in the censer.
- 6. After all have finished, pray silently together until the fragrance of the incense is all used.

Resources: Resource Sheet 53, paper, pens, hand censer, lamp, icon, incense grains, charcoal, flower arrangement.

Review: Flowers and incense help to make worship a whole-body experience.

Follow Up: For next week ask your priest to show and explain his vestments, their use and symbolism.
