## **Core Activities and Learning**

- 1. Ask students why trust is important in relationships? What does it mean to trust someone?
- 2. Ask them if they know/remember Noah's story? Ask one of the students to read Hebrew 11:7 (see the resource sheet) and then to tell the story of Noah.
- 3. What do we learn from this story? Do you think Noah trusted God? Why? What could have happened if he hadn't trusted God? What example is Noah for us? What does it mean to trust the Lord?

- 5. What have these games taught us about trusting God?
