Learning objectives: Our relationships in church is true by Communion

Core Activities and Learning

- The Holy Trinity is revealed both in The Old Testament and in The New Testament. One God in three persons, Father, Son and Holy Spirit, Created the world (Genesis 1:1-3), and created man, The pronouns "Us-Our" in Genesis 1:26 reveal a plurality of divine Persons and the word "image" is in the singular and shows the three distinct Persons of the Holy Trinity are one in nature and undivided. For it does not say, "Our images". Therefore, the Holy Trinity is one undivided nature in three distinct Persons.
- ❖ God The Father created the heavens and the earth (Genesis 1:1), (The Creed), He is our Redeemer (Isaiah 63:16)
- God The Holy Spirit hovered over creation in creative power and equality with The Father (Genesis 1:2), Spirit of truth (John 14:17) prophesy (Acts 2:17), (Joel 3:1-5), The Father sent Him at Pentecost to help, to teach all things (John 14:26), and to testify to the Son (John 15:26).
- God the Son, The Word, Jesus was present with The Father at the beginning of creation (Genesis 1:3), (John 1:1-3), He is begotten from The Father before all time and ages (Creed), all authority has been given to Him in heaven and on earth (Matthew 28:18), True God and eternal (1 John 5:20) who does not honour the Son does not honour the Father (John 5:23).
- The Incarnate Son fully reveals The Holy Trinity (Luke 1:35), (Matthew 3:16-17). The Holy Trinity created man to have truly fellowship with The Father and with His Son Jesus Christ (1 John 1:3) 'that they all may be one, as you Father (John 10:30), are in me, and I in you (John 14:20); that they also may be One in us (John 17:20-21).' Jesus is in the Father, and the Father who dwells in Jesus does the works (John 14:9-10). There are diversities of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are differences of ministries, but the same Lord. And there are diversities of activities, but it is the same God who works all in all (1 Corinthians 12:4-6), so we shall "Go therefore and make disciples for all the nations, baptising them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things that Jesus have commanded us; and he will be with us always, even to the end of the age Amen" (Matthew 28:18-20)
